Introduction

Over the last few years, there has been a surge of self-published works (both actual novels and fanfiction). This project aims to figure out what main genres and tropes people love to read and write! Turning these genres and tags into a Twine pick-your-own ending novel is an easier and more interactive way for general audiences to see the genre spread and explore new tags or ideas that are unfamiliar to them.

Methodology

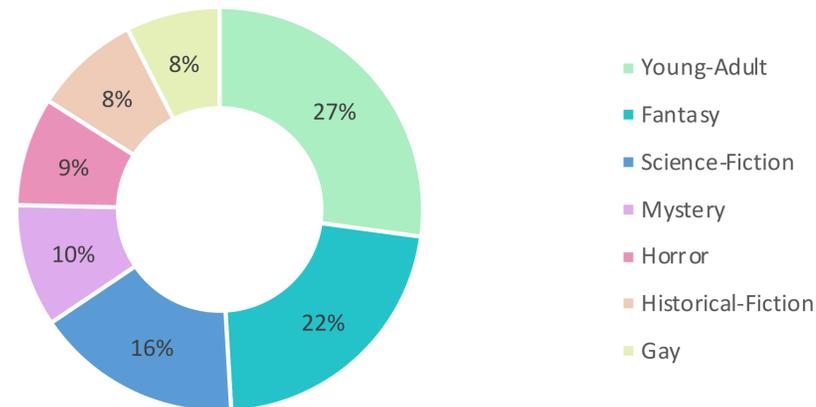
1. Find the most popular genres and tags from a range of sites that offer self-publishing options: Archive of Our Own, Wattpad, Fanfiction.net, Smashwords, Rakuten Kobo, Lulu and Mindstir.
2. Get the most popular ones for the each website by using the search option and imputed the most popular words in English (the, be, to, of, and, a, in) to get the widest range of titles possible.
3. Take all the tags per word and get the average for each tag and then average results per website.
4. The averages could be compared and contrasted and added up to form a master list of most popular tags and genres.

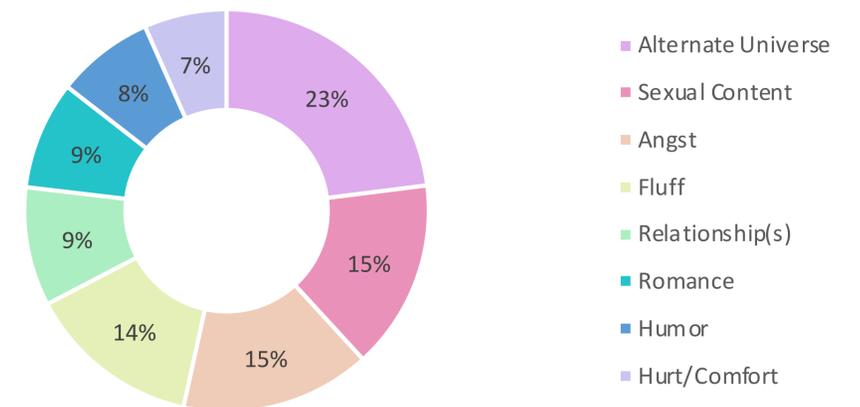
